Here at Atlantic Cape, the Fall semester always starts with a sense of new opportunity and moving forward and we are excited to welcome our students back for the 2021-22

academic year, both in person and virtually. While we continue to work through the ongoing challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, our focus remains supporting the success of our students. I would like to share a few updates with you about some exciting initiatives we have implemented for the Fall semester to expand access to education and provide our students with the tools they need to succeed.

First, every student registered for the Fall semester, both new and returning, is receiving three free credits in the form of a tuition waiver. We feel that offering a free course is a great way to encourage students to begin or continue their college education, as well as reducing the financial burden.

Additionally, we are offering a new loaner laptop to all students who have enrolled in at least six (6) credits. Students will be able to keep the laptop after graduation. The college purchased 3,000 laptops and distribution is underway. Our aim for this program is to set our students up for academic success by ensuring that they have the technology they need to successfully complete their coursework regardless of the course modality.

These are just a few of the innovative opportunities that we have been able to offer, thanks to federal HEERF funds, that will help support our students as they pursue their academic and career goals.

I would also like to take a moment to congratulate our Class of 2021 graduates, who persevered to reach their educational goals in spite of the obstacles they encountered. While graduating with a college degree is always a commendable achievement, this is an especially noteworthy accomplishment given the unprecedented challenges our students have faced due to the pandemic, and I could not be prouder of them.

I invite all of our graduates to stay involved and stay in touch with us by joining our Alumni Association. Our alumni are the leaders of the future and are equipped with the tools to make a real impact on our community

The Atlantic Cape Alumni Association would like to congratulate the 700+ students that recently graduated from Atlantic Cape Community College in May! Class of 2021 graduates had two opportunities to celebrate their achievements. A drive-through Commencement ceremony was held on May 20 on the Mays Landing Campus where nearly 200 graduates paraded through the campus quad to collect their diploma, take photos with family members, President Dr. Barbara Gaba, and college faculty and staff, and receive a swag bag from the Alumni Association.

Additionally, a unique and personalized virtual commencement ceremony was held on June 9. The online graduation event included remarks from Atlantic Cape President Dr. Barbara Gaba, Student Government Association President Joelle Motley, high honors student Charlene Acevedo, and former Atlantic Cape student Dr. Natasha Corbitt. Dr. Corbitt is the country's first African-American female pediatric surgeon with a double doctorate, both an M.D. and Ph.D, and only the 16th Black woman to become a pediatric surgeon in the United States.

### **Overall Distinguished Alumni Award Recipients**



Madeline Quinn Seidenstricker | Class of 1971 Liberal Arts – Education Option, A.A.

After graduating from Oakcrest High School,

Madeline earned her associate's from Atlantic Cape before transferring to Montclair State University for her bachelor's degree. She earned a master's in teaching from Glassboro State College (now Rowan

University). While enrolled in a doctoral program at Temple University, Madeline served as an adjunct instructor of English at Atlantic Cape.

Madeline began her career in international teaching and public service, taking teaching assignments in Australia, Liberia, and Kenya, before joining the U.S. Department of State as a Foreign Service Officer.

During her 25-year career, Madeline rose to a senior rank in the State Department as a political and military affairs analyst in U.S. Embassies in Serbia, Ethiopia, Bulgaria, South Africa, and the African Bureau in Washington, D.C. Her career was focused on human rights, political and military issues, and African affairs. Upon retirement, Madeline returned to South Jersey and to teaching at Atlantic Cape.

She spends her free time volunteering with HEARTS Therapeutic Riding Center in Egg Harbor Township.



Donna Vassallo | Class of 1985 Hospitality Management, A.A.S.

In addition to being an alumnae, Donna is a former

longtime Atlantic Cape Foundation board member (1998-2004), a full-time instructor retiring in June 2021, and a 2009 Lindback Distinguished Teaching Excellence Award winner.

After earning an associate's degree from Atlantic Cape, Donna transferred to Widener University for her bachelor's degree. She attained a master's in 2006 from Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Over the years, Donna has served as an adjunct faculty member for the Hospitality Management and Business divisions at Atlantic Cape, worked for Claridge Casino Hotel as the director of recruitment and staffing, and served as the corporate human resources manager for Spencer's Gifts. She also established her own consulting firm, Donna Vassallo Associates, LLC.

Donna's senior positions at the college include dean of Career Education and Workforce Development, dean of the Worthington Atlantic City Campus, and dean of Professional Studies, High School Initiatives, and Internships. She continues to support the college's mission and Foundation's fundraising efforts, including establishing a scholarship in memory of her late father, Dominic.

# Tasty Travels with Chef Karen Miller

The Fall is still a great time to get creative with outdoor cooking! This time of year is your grill's time to shine! Change of your hot dog and hamburger grilling routine by making something different and healthy, like the recipe below, for a dish that is sure to impress your guests at your next gathering, big or small.



Recipe

Whipped Feta Dip with Grilled Eggplant

#### Ingredients:

- 12 oz. crumbled feta cheese (pull from refrigerator one hour before preparing dish)
- ¾ cup sour cream
- 2 tsp. fresh ground pepper, divided
- 2 Tbsp. fresh dill plus 1 tsp.
- Sprinkle of salt
- 1 medium eggplant, cut into half-moons, skin on
- ½ cup olive oil
- 1 Tbsp. fresh oregano, chopped
- ¼ cup extra virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste

#### Directions:

In a small bowl, toss the Eggplant slices with the ½ cup of olive oil and season with salt and pepper. After all pieces are coated in oil, place carefully onto a hot grill. Flip once after eggplant is seared and has gotten nice grill marks. Cook until tender, remove and allow to cool. In a food processor, combine feta cheese, sour cream, 1 tsp. black pepper, 2 Tbsp. fresh dill and a sprinkle of salt. Process until mixture is smooth and all ingredients are combined.

Spoon feta mixture in a shallow bowl and spread to create small canals in cheese. Arrange eggplant on the feta and sprinkle with oregano, remaining dill and pepper. Drizzle extra virgin olive oil on the entire dish. Serve with warm pita, crostini or additional vegetables such as cucumbers, cherry tomatoes or carrots.  $\mathcal{C}$
