# Cape May County Campus and the Cape May BizHub

 Atlantic Cape's Cape May County Campus and the Cape May BizHub was awarded the 2024 Business Partner of the Year Award from the Greater Wildwood Chamber of Commerce and the Business Community of the Wildwoods for our outstanding service and partnership in the Wildwoods.

#### Grants Update

- Atlantic Cape was awarded \$37,500 for the *Hunger-Free Campus Grant Program* initiative from the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE). The grant funds help address basic food needs on all three campuses, raise awareness of campus services that address food insecurity, and continues to build strategic partnerships at the local, state, and national levels to address food insecurity among students.
- The College was also awarded \$44,100 for the *Educational Opportunity Fund's Special Projects* grant initiative also from the Office of the Secretary of Higher Education (OSHE). The grant funds support services to help students complete their first year at Atlantic Cape.
