Community Outreach – Atlantic County

 Throughout April, the Office of Community Outreach participated in the Children's Health Fair in Egg Harbor Township, providing 150 hot dogs and promoting health resources to families. The college also hosted the Mexican Consulate of Philadelphia for the fifth consecutive year, offering essential services such as consular documents and immigration assistance to the local community. This year, we were able to service 180 people at the Consulate compared to 160 serviced last year. Additionally, Atlantic Cape sponsored an informational table at the Oceanside Family Success Center's "Spring Egg Hunt Event," where families enjoyed festivities while learning about educational opportunities and community support through Inlet CDC.

Community Outreach – Cape May

- Atlantic Cape hosted an Open House event on Wednesday, April 9, from 5:00 PM to 6:30 PM at our Cape May County Campus. The event allowed prospective students and community members to tour the campus, meet faculty and staff, explore academic and career programs, and learn about financial aid options. The Open House aimed to support enrollment efforts and engage potential students through personalized guidance and informational resources.
- The Cape May County campus hosted its first *Business Day* event on April 4, which included nearly 50 students from Lower Cape May Regional and Middle Township high schools who attended workshops aimed at introducing them to various business career pathways. The event featured a keynote speaker, Brady Schoenrock, the chief operating officer of Maypoint Hospitality, who

shared his journey on how he came into his current position and stressed the importance of a college education. Students also attended workshop sessions where they learned more about real estate, landscaping, craft brewing, and the restaurant industry, and a workshop geared for high school girls to learn strong leadership skills and take control of their future.

Cape May County bizHub

 After the success of the 4-part Business Symposium that occurred from the end of January to early February, the Cape May bizHub created more opportunities for small business owners and entrepreneurs to learn how to utilize social media for their business. The bizHub hosted the second session of a new four-part series of workshops, titled "Social Media Workshop 2: Effective Ways to Market and Grow Engagement on Social Media," on April 18. The workshop demonstrated how small business owners or entrepreneurs could effectively market their small businesses and grow their digital footprint to reach new potential customers.
