Community Partnerships

• The Cape May County Campus welcomed Cooper University Hospital Cape Regional to campus as Cooper hosted their staff training at the College, utilizing our nursing lab in Cape May from August 19 to September 20.

Inlet Community Development Corporation (CDC)

• The Inlet CDC Team attended the Governor's Conference on Housing and Economic Development at Harrah's Casino Hotel in Atlantic City. The event featured Governor Phil Murphy as a guest speaker, offering valuable insights into regional development and economic initiatives.



Community Outreach – Atlantic County

• Atlantic Cape proudly sponsored and hosted informational booths at various back-to-school events in the community. These informational booths provided valuable insights into our programs, admissions, and student resources,

engaging with students and parents and sharing the opportunities at Atlantic Cape. These events included the Coalition for a Safe Community in Egg Harbor City, Pleasantville, Somers Point, and Atlantic City during late August and early September.

- Atlantic Cape's Inlet Community Development Corporation (CDC) hosted the Summer Send-off Cruise for Inlet residents on August 25. The event featured light hors d'oeuvres, music, and a scenic boat tour that showcased the Inlet, Snug Harbor, Absecon, and Brigantine Beach.
- Atlantic Cape partnered with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention and Hard Rock Atlantic City at their annual *Out of the Darkness Walk* on September 7. The event provided the essential back to school supplies for the community, featuring a back pack give away.
