April is Community College Month, and as we take this opportunity to spread awareness about the importance of community colleges and to get the word out about all that Atlantic Cape has to offer, I

wanted to highlight a few of the College's recent accomplishments and events.

Atlantic Cape signed the Rutgers Premier Partnership on Wednesday, February 14th, our third university partnership signed this academic year. This partnership provides students the ability to earn a degree from Rutgers Camden while also beginning their program courses here at Atlantic Cape. Additionally, in a number of majors, the Rutgers Camden partnership provides students the option to actually complete their bachelor's degree program right here on our Mays Landing campus if they choose. We are excited to expand our ongoing partnership with Rutgers University along with Stockton University and Thomas Jefferson University. We can't wait to see where these opportunities will take our students.

We finally held the long-awaited Groundbreaking Ceremony on Thursday, February 15th for the construction of our home baseball field. Attendees included Atlantic County Commissioners, Board of Trustee and Foundation Board members, coaches, players, alumni baseball players and college supporters. With this new home field, scheduled to be ready for the 2025 season, Atlantic Cape and our team will be able to attract more local student athletes by offering a better equipped program and facilities. Atlantic Cape is once again demonstrating its commitment to athletics by providing the necessary facilities for student athletes to excel.

I am very pleased to share that over 800 guests attended the 41st Annual Restaurant Gala, held at Harrah's Waterfront Conference Center on March 21st. The Gala raised a record breaking \$306,210 in scholarships for our students in the Academy of Culinary Arts and emergency funds for all students. This is just one of many examples of the generosity of our supporters to help students reach their educational goals regardless of their financial situation. We are immensely grateful to the efforts of the Atlantic Cape Foundation, student and staff volunteers, our generous donors, sponsors, participating restaurants, and attendees, in making this event a great success year after year.

The Cape May bizHub, located on our Cape May County campus, is a leading small business resource center working as an active part of a concentrated County-wide effort to educate, develop, support, and attract businesses that contribute to the growth of the Cape May County economy. Atlantic Cape Breaks Ground on its New Mays Landing Campus Baseball Field



Atlantic Cape officially broke ground on its new \$1.48 million baseball field of dreams on February 15 that will permanently bring the Buccaneers' baseball program home in time for the 2025 season.

To drum up support for this ambitious project, the Atlantic Cape Foundation created the "Bring it Home" fundraising campaign in 2020 and thanks to the generosity of its donors raised \$186,000 to date. After several years of planning, fundraising, architectural design, environmental approvals, community and alumni outreach, construction began in early February as excavators descended upon the parcel of land situated behind the Rutgers Lifelong Learning Center.

Atlantic Cape and Rutgers University-Camden Sign Premier Partnership Agreement Creating New Educational Opportunities for Students

Atlantic Cape Community College President Dr. Barbara Gaba and Rutgers University-Camden Chancellor Dr. Antonio D. Tillis officially signed a memorandum of understanding on February 14 in Atlantic Cape's Mays Landing campus STEM Building creating a Premier Partnership between the two institutions of higher education.

This partnership will create new educational opportunities for Atlantic Cape students to seamlessly continue their undergraduate education at Rutgers University-Camden through a sequential degree program once they have earned their respective associate's degree at Atlantic Cape.

It will also allow participating students to fully matriculate into Rutgers University-Camden with 60 completed credits, pay the Atlantic Cape tuition and fee rate for their third year, and expand access to higher education in Atlantic and Cape May counties, and the State of New Jersey.

Students will also have access to academic advisors at both institutions before completing their classwork at Atlantic Cape and have the



option to attend certain Rutgers—Camden classes on Atlantic Cape's Mays Landing campus through the Rutgers Statewide program.

Atlantic Cape Alumna Gina Harvell Receives Rutgers Continuing Studies First Ever Lifelong Learner Award

For Atlantic City native Gina Harvell it began as a dream, one that seemed impossible and unimaginable. Homelessness and drug addiction had led her to existing day-in and day-out in Brown's Park located across the street from Atlantic Cape Community College's Charles D. Worthington Atlantic City campus. It was here where Harvell would spend innumerable hours wondering, dreaming and hoping for brighter days.

While access to higher education was never physically far away, for Harvell the

distance appeared to be an unbridgeable gulf. She believed in herself and her dreams, and received unwavering support from her husband, children, family and friends. Harvell would eventually rid herself of her demons, surviving breast cancer, earning her GED in 2010, her associate's degree from Atlantic Cape in 2020, her bachelor's degree from Rutgers University on the Mays Landing campus in 2022 and later this spring, her master's degree in social work from Rutgers as well.

Recognizing these accomplishments and personal perseverance, Rutgers Statewide, Division of Continuing Studies Vice President Richard J. Novak presented Harvell with the inaugural Lifelong Learner Award, whose creation was inspired by her story, on Thursday, January 11 at Atlantic Cape's Mays Landing campus.

"We love heroes. Heroes who do things that we never thought we could do. Gina falls into this category," said Novak.
