He advised graduates to use their education as a tool to overcome the challenges they may face, in order to create the change they would like to see for their lives and the world around them. It was a tremendous send off to our graduating class. Recently, Atlantic Cape celebrated another major milestone in its 60th anniversary as a community college on its Mays Landing campus. Hundreds of attendees, including students, alumni, staff, faculty, and residents, came together to showcase the celebrations with food, live musical entertainment, and much more. Also, we celebrated the 40th anniversary of the Worthington Atlantic City campus with an open-to-the-public block party.

I am also very pleased to share that this year, the Atlantic Cape Foundations awarded more than \$792,000 in student scholarships to 524 students. This amount was the highest in the history of the Foundation. Atlantic Cape Awards \$366,504 in Scholarships to 211 Students During 57th Annual Scholarship Recognition Banquet





The 57th Annual Atlantic Cape Community College Foundation Scholarship Recognition Ceremony acknowledged the unwavering generosity and continued support of the college's sponsors and donors. The Foundation also recognized the tremendous academic achievements of Atlantic Cape's students by awarding 351 individual scholarships worth \$366,504 to 211 students on May 13 in the Jonathan Pitney Hall Gymnasium on the Mays Landing campus.

The evening's festivities were attended by 298 people, including 105 students, 93 guests, 52 scholarship donors, and 48 board members, college faculty and staff. The outpouring of giving from such donors has allowed the Atlantic Cape Foundation to support thousands of Atlantic and Cape May County students over the past 57 years and given them the financial means to pursue their academic dreams. In Giving Year 2023, the Foundation awarded 567 scholarships worth \$591,117 to Atlantic Cape students. The Foundation received \$789,836 from 596 donors and sponsors. Meanwhile, \$46,000 was raised in direct support for Atlantic Cape, \$12,190 was raised for emergency funds and \$9,290 for the Campus Food Pantry. Since the Foundation's beginning in 1978, it has raised millions of dollars for student scholarships, academic programs and enhancing the campus environment. The Foundation's mission is to provide funding and support to the college, its students and educational endeavors through special event fundraising and community philanthropy.

Atlantic Cape Awards More Than 900 Associate's Degrees and Certificates at 57th Annual Commencement Ceremony

Despite rainy and windy conditions, hundreds of boisterous families, friends and loved ones gathered together to watch nearly 400 students receive their degrees and certificates at Atlantic Cape's 57th Annual Commencement Ceremony on May 16 at the Mays Landing campus Quad.

A total of 904 associate's degrees, including 47 to high school students from Atlantic and Cape May counties who took part in the Early College Program, and 23 certificates were awarded this year to 919 students ranging in age from 17 to 68.

Atlantic Cape President Dr. Barbara Gaba, proudly standing on stage surrounded by members of the college's Board of Trustees, Foundation Board, President's cabinet, staff and university partners, welcomed all in attendance to the festivities and commended each graduate on their tremendous accomplishments.

"You have shown incredible resilience from the first time you walked through the doors of your first class, through all of the challenges, to where you are today, here celebrating a milestone as you graduate with an associate's degree or certificate," said Dr. Gaba.

Keynote speaker Dr. Brian Bridges, secretary of higher education for the State of New Jersey, spoke to the graduates about remembering the struggles they have overcome and the mentors who helped them along the way. 4.0 Honors Student representative Abigail Tomasso, who received an Associate in Applied Science degree in Hospitality Management, spoke on behalf of the 24 other graduates who earned a perfect grade point average. Outgoing Student Government Association (SGA) President Sultana Zakia spoke about how Atlantic Cape helped teach her leadership.

less fortunate, and actively engaged in community service. Ms. Tunnell retired from Atlantic County Department of Family & Community Development as an Assistant Administrative Supervisor for Family Services.

The Atlantic Cape Foundation Board wishes to recognize Ms. Tunnell posthumously for her tireless and exemplary service creating opportunities for Atlantic Cape students while serving on the Atlantic Cape Community College Foundation Board from 2002 until 2022. She was also a member of Atlantic Cape's Equal Opportunity Fund (EOF) Advisory Board for 25 years, including serving as its first female chairperson in 1988.

Additionally, Ms. Tunnell served on Atlantic Cape's Minority Affairs Committee raising funds for scholarships for at-risk minority students attending the college and was the Founder of the Melvin L. Newton Scholarship.
